The design and customs associated with it originated in the Irish fishing village of the same name in Galway. The ring, as currently known, was first produced in the 17th century.



My heart melted, and I quickly said, "3 baskets, please!" I handed the young mother \$10.00 and said to keep the change for an ice cream for the little girl. We had traveled about 10 miles and decided we would eat a peach. The fuzz was still on the peach. It was the best peach I had ever eaten. I had discovered "South Carolina" peaches. Juice was pouring down our chins, and we were looking for old McDonalds napkins in the car, thanking the Lord for our good luck because there was also a cheap gas station just ahead.

Imagine my surprise when shortly after I moved here, I saw a notice - "Sign up to go to the Peach" Stand!" I couldn't wait! The day finally came, and we arrived at the Peach Stand. I looked around for the peach orchard and saw no peach trees. The bus emptied guickly and I thought I better hurry in or they will buy all the peaches. Inside only a few peaches were in sight; gnarly little things. "Where are the peaches?" I asked. "They will be here in about 2 weeks," I was told. I investigated the shop and found some homemade pimento cheese. As I paid, I saw no one from Westminster Towers. Thinking I was keeping the bus waiting, I asked the clerk where all the people from Westminster Towers were. She replied, "Every one of them are in the back eating ice cream." "ICE CREAM!" It was established over 100 years ago and is now operated by her nephew's son, Spencer McLeod. The McLeod Peach Farm is located in McBee, South Carolina. It has a shop selling the best peaches in South Carolina, a good restaurant, a bakery, a fresh vegetable stand, and even an antique museum. Best of all I was told, they have the best black cherry ice cream and other flavors too. I am going to make a suggestion, purely in my self-interest, that we take a trip to McBee, SC. 
